## Transactions in connection with share buyback programme

On 7 February 2024, Pandora announced a new share buyback programme, cf. Company announcement no. 843. The share buyback programme is executed in accordance with Regulation (EU) No 596/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 16 April 2014 on market abuse (market abuse regulation).

The purpose of the programme is to reduce Pandora's share capital and to meet obligations arising from company incentive programmes.

Under the programme Pandora will repurchase shares for an aggregate maximum amount of DKK 4.0 billion from 8 February 2024 until 31 January 2025 at the latest, both days inclusive. The first tranche of DKK 1.3 billion was finished on 11 June 2024. The second tranche of up to DKK 1.3 billion commenced on 13 June 2024 and will finish no later than 27 September 2024. Pandora has appointed SEB as the sole lead manager for the second tranche.

With the transactions stated above, Pandora owns a total of 1,617,754 treasury shares, corresponding to 2% of the Company's share capital.
