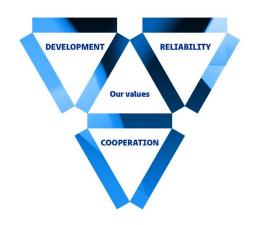

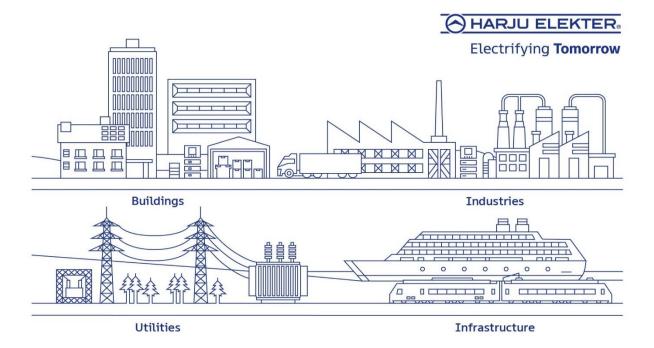
Harju Elekter is an international industrial group with extensive experience in providing future proof solutions for electrical power distribution. Harju Elekter Group has its roots and head office in Estonia, and production plants in four countries: Estonia, Finland, Sweden and Lithuania.

#### What we do

Harju Elekter contributes to a sustainable society by providing future-proof electrical power distribution solutions.



We engineer, manufacture, and install electrification solutions for utilities, industries, infrastructure, public and commercial buildings.



The Harju Elekter Group operates in two main areas, which are presented as separate segments.



**Production** – designing, selling, manufacturing, and after-sales servicing of power distribution, switching and converting devices and automation, process control and industrial control equipment. The core business generates approximately 95% of the Group's revenue.



**Real estate** – developing of industrial real estate, project management, renting and the accompanying services to rental partners and to the Harju Elekter Group companies. This segment generates approximately 2% of the Group's revenue.

Other activities that are not significant enough to be reported as separate segments, and the accompanying risks and rewards of which were not materially different and clearly identifiable, are presented together as other activities. These include managing financial investments, retail and project sales of electrical goods, and electrical installation work in shipbuilding.

#### MANAGEMENT REPORT

#### COMMENTARY FROM THE MANAGEMENT

Harju Elekter's 2024 began with more modest results than in the year before. In the longer term, however, it was still a strong first quarter. Despite our efforts to minimise seasonality, the Q1 and Q4 results tend to be weaker than the Q2 and Q3 results. In this year as well, the significant increase in production volumes started in March, and based on orders is expected to continue until the end of autumn.

The biggest contribution to the financial results originated from production in Lithuania, and from production in Estonia to some extent. The Finnish production unit has a number of activities ahead to restore its profitability, and we can be increasingly optimistic about the Swedish unit's return to profitability, which has taken longer time than anticipated. Amendments to the Finnish national energy network regulations that govern distribution networks had a significant economic impact on sales results in Estonia and Finland, resulting in reduced investments for the current and coming years.

On 11 March this year, the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council banning the use of fluorinated greenhouse gases (SF6) in electrical equipment from 2026 entered into force. For Harju Elekter, this will very likely mean that a number of electricity grid contracts will be amended or cancelled in 2025. As equipment manufacturers are only starting up their production of SF6-free equipment, a shortage situation could emerge in the market, affecting both the availability of equipment and leading to a sharp increase in prices. This, in turn, will lead to significant fluctuations in the volume of orders for complex substations before and after the commissioning date of said equipment.

By today, we have completed the restructuring commenced in the second half of 2022, which transformed the management of the Group and its subsidiaries, sharpened the focus on core activities, and provided for other important steps to be ready for the implementation of the new strategic development plan. There is no development without growth, which is why we will keep looking for opportunities to continue profitable growth in both existing and new locations.

#### SUMMARY OF THE FIRST QUARTER RESULTS

#### Revenue and financial results

Harju Elekter earned revenue of 46.8 (2023 Q1: 45.3) million euros in the reporting quarter. While revenue increased, profitability declined compared to the previous year. The three-month gross profit was 4.8 (2023 Q1: 5.4) million euros, resulting in a gross profit margin of 10.3% (2023 Q1: 11.9%). Operating profit (EBIT) amounted to 1.0 (2023 Q1: 1.3) million euros, with an operating margin of 2.1% (2023 Q1: 2.9%). Net profit for the first quarter was 0.4 (2023 Q1: 0.7) million euros. Earnings per share for the first quarter were 0.02 (2023 Q1: 0.04) euros.

#### **Investments**

During the reporting period, Harju Elekter invested a total of 0.7 (2023 Q1: 0.6) million euros in non-current assets, including 0.4 (2023 Q1: 0.3) million euros in investment properties, 0.1 (2023 Q1: 0.3) million euros in property, plant, and equipment and 0.2 (2023 Q1: 0.1) million euros in intangible assets. The investments primarily focused on extensive renovation and reconstruction works in the Keila Industrial Park, aimed at meeting the long-term needs of a tenant, Prysmian Group Baltics. Additionally, investments were made in production technology equipment and production and process management systems.

The total value of the Group's long-term financial investments as of the reporting date was 29.3 (31.12.23: 29.2) million euros. There were no acquisitions or disposals. The fair value of listed securities increased by 70 thousand euros during the reporting quarter.

#### **Current assets**

The Group's current assets increased by 9.7 million euros to 87.8 million euros during the first three months. Trade and other receivables increased by 10.2 million euros to 49.0 million euros, while inventories decreased by 0.9 million euros to 35.9 million euros. Compared to the same period last year, inventories decreased by 20%, or 8.8 million euros. During the reporting quarter, the balance of work in progress increased while the value of raw

materials decreased. Materials and components accounted for 72% (31.12.23: 79%), of total inventories at the end of the reporting period, with the remaining portion consisting of unfinished and finished goods.

#### Liabilities

As of the reporting date, the total amount of liabilities for the Group was 97.3 (31.12.23: 88.4 and 31.03.23: 97.0) million euros, with the current portion accounting for 76% (31.12.23: 73%). Over the year, current liabilities decreased by 2.5 million euros, but increased by 9.2 million euros during the first quarter, mainly due to seasonality. Within current liabilities, borrowings increased by 3.2 million euros, customer prepayments by 2.0 million euros, trade and other payables by 4.3 million euros, while tax liabilities decreased by 0.3 million euros during the quarter.

The total amount of non-current liabilities as of the reporting date was 23.2 million euros, nearly unchanged compared to the end of the previous year and increased by 2.8 million euros compared to the same period last year. At the end of the period, current and non-current borrowings were respectively 22.6 (31.12.23: 19.4) and 23.2 (31.12.23: 23.5) million euros.

#### **Cash Flows**

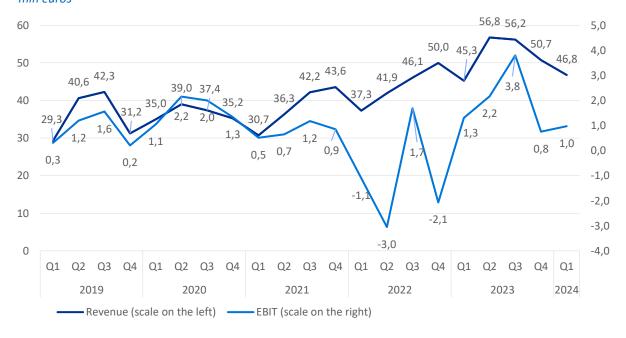
In the first quarter, the Group's cash flows from operating activities totaled -2.1 (2023 Q1: -1.3) million euros. The primary impact came from the growth in operating-related receivables, prepayments, liabilities, and deferred revenues. The company allocated resources towards product completion and realization of revenues, which in turn increased operational expenditures associated with production volume.

Investing activities directed 0.9 (2023 Q1: 0.4) million euros, entirely towards investments in real estate, tangible and intangible assets acquisitions. The cash flow from financing activities was primarily influenced by loan and lease payments. Current and non-current loans were repaid by 1.2 million euros; overdrafts and factoring liabilities increased by a total of 4.3 million euros. Overall, the cash flow from financing activities in the first quarter was 2.9 (2023 Q1: -6.3) million euros.

In summary, the company's cash flows for the reporting quarter amounted to 0.1 million euros, compared to -8.1 million euros a year earlier.

#### CHANGES IN THE STRUCTURE OF THE GROUP

#### Changes in the management

On 2nd January, Jari Jylli assumed the position of Managing Director at Harju Elekter Oy. At the same time, he took over the duties of the Managing Director of Harju Elekter Kiinteistöt Oy, as the former Managing Director, Simo Puustelli, retired.

#### Intra-Group restructuring

In January, the merger of LC Development Fastigheter 17 AB, a subsidiary of Harju Elekter AB that manages the factory, with Harju Elekter Services AB was entered into the Swedish business register.

#### **MAIN EVENTS**

#### Recognition

On March 14th, the laureates of the 'Smart Industry 2024' industrial sector event were announced during the gala. In the category of large enterprises, AS Harju Elekter was awarded the title of Factory of the Year 2024.

According to the competition jury, Harju Elekter stood out as an excellent implementer of Lean methodologies, measuring the benefits derived from them. Additionally, over the past two years, the company has successfully merged and updated its two Keila factories, actively involving factory workers in development work, emphasizing clear goals and digitalization, and paying attention to workplace safety.

The Group's revenue in the first quarter was 46.8 million euros, representing a 3.3% growth compared to the same period last year. Sales of electrical equipment showed stable growth and made a significant contribution to the company's revenue, amounting to 42.2 million euros and accounting for 90.3% of total quarterly revenue. The majority of electrical equipment sales consisted of substations, low-voltage distribution equipment, technical buildings, and subcontracting services.

Lease income from real estate properties increased significantly due to the commissioning of a new production facility in the Allika Industrial Park, reaching 1.1 million euros and thereby comprising 2.4% of total quarterly revenue.

Revenue from electrical works in the shipbuilding sector decreased mainly due to the completion of larger projects last year. The contribution of this sector to total revenue decreased by 1.4 percentage points to 2.2% in the guarter.

The main production output of the manufacturing segment consists of equipment for medium and low-voltage electrical distribution, various electrical switching and transforming devices, as well as automation and control panels for energy, industrial, marine, and infrastructure projects. Additionally, companies within the manufacturing segment also provide various design and engineering services. The production segment's revenue increased by 4.2% compared to previous quarters, amounting to 44.4 million euros. Significant revenue growth was driven by the Lithuanian production unit, focusing on developing products and solutions for system integrators and contract manufacturing in the marine and industrial sectors, delivering specially designed energy distribution and frequency inverter devices for specific customer needs. The manufacturing segment accounted for 94.9% of consolidated revenue in the reporting quarter.

Harju Elekter Group's real estate unit engages in industrial real estate development, project management, leasing, and related services. In the reporting quarter, revenue from real estate segment services amounted to 1.3 (2023 Q1: 1.0) million euros, comprising 2.8% (2023 Q1: 2.3%). of total revenue.

Revenue from other activities decreased by 0.6 million euros compared to the same period last year, totaling 1.0 million euros in the first quarter. The decline in revenue was influenced by a decrease in electrical works compared to the previous year. Revenue from other activities accounted for 2.3% of quarterly revenue.

The Group's first-quarter revenue by market reflected diverse developments compared to the same period last year. The Group's largest target markets, Estonia, Finland, Sweden, and Norway, together accounted for 80.6% of total revenue in the first quarter, representing a significant increase compared to the previous year (2023 Q1: 75.3%).

Estonia and Finland markets were more modest compared to the previous year. In the reporting quarter, revenue from Estonia amounted to 4.5 (2023 Q1: 5.0) million euros, comprising 9.6% (2023 Q1: 10.9%) of consolidated revenue. Sales of substations and cable distribution cabinets to electricity distribution sector clients decreased, while rental income from real estate properties increased. From the Finnish market, revenue amounted to 17.0 million euros, which is 8.9% less than the previous year. The majority portion of the revenue decline was due to reduced sales of electrical equipment and electrical works. Sales of substations to electricity distribution sector customers and electric vehicle chargers remained modest.

There was a significant growth in the Norwegian market, where revenue doubled to 9.3 million euros, primarily from the sale of low-voltage equipment to maritime sector customers. The Norwegian market accounted for 19.9% of consolidated revenue in the reporting quarter. Revenue from the Swedish market also slightly increased, reaching 6.9 (2023 Q1: 6.5) million euros, indicating stable development in this market segment.

Revenue from Germany and the Netherlands was somewhat lower compared to the previous year, amounting to 2.2 (2023 Q1: 2.5) and 1.0 (2023 Q1: 3.9) million euros, respectively. Revenue from other smaller markets amounted to 5.8 (2023 Q1: 4.8) million euros, with more sales primarily to the USA, Lithuania, and Spain.

The Group's operating expenses in the reporting quarter totaled 45.7 (2023 Q1: 43.8) million euros. The main part of the increase in operating expenses came from a 5.2% rise in the costs of goods sold and services, which lagged behind the growth rate of revenue by 1.9 percentage points in the first quarters. The gross profit margin decreased by 1.6 percentage points compared to the comparable first quarter, reaching 10.3%. The product portfolio has remained unchanged compared to a year ago, but the unique characteristics of projects and changes in the proportion of products sold and market share, along with increased labour costs, have impacted gross profit. There has been some increase in material and component prices in certain categories.

Marketing expenses decreased by 11.8% to 1.2 million euros, representing 2.6% of both the Group's operating expenses and revenue. Administrative expenses decreased by 2.4% to 2.5 million euros compared to previous quarters, representing 5.5% of the Group's operating expenses and 5.4% of revenue for the reporting quarter. Depreciation and amortization cost amounted to 1.0 (2023 Q1: 1.1) million euros in the reporting quarter.

Labour costs increased by 5.7% compared to previous quarters, amounting to 10.0 million euros. Labour costs represented 21,5% (2023 Q1: 21.0%) of the Group's revenue in the reporting quarter. The average monthly salary per employee in the first quarter of 2024 was 2,862 (2023 Q1: 2,568) euros, representing an 11.4% increase compared to the previous year.

#### **PERSONNEL**

In the reporting quarter, Harju Elekter's teams continued their participation in the values program, whose three main pillars - **DEVELOPMENT**, **COOPERATION** and **TRUST** - reflect the Group company's business activities and interactions with colleagues, customers, and partners. As part of the program, a values-based management training was organized for all leaders of the Lithuanian subsidiary.

In each Harju Elekter unit, follow-up actions were agreed based on feedback from employee surveys to ensure team well-being and satisfaction. Participation took place in several career fairs, focusing on identifying young talent and engineers, including events at TalTech and Tallinn University of Applied Sciences.

As of the end of the reporting period, the Group employed a total of 964 people, which is 7 fewer employees than the previous year. The average number of employees was 953 people, showing a slight increase compared to the previous year. The largest growth occurred in the production units in Lithuania and Finland, while the number of employees decreased significantly in the Estonian production.

#### NOTES TO INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENT

#### Lisa 1 Accounting methods and valuation principles used in the consolidated interim report

AS Harju Elekter Group is a company registered in Estonia. The interim report prepared as of 31 March 2024 comprises AS Harju Elekter Group (the "Parent Company") and its subsidiaries AS Harju Elekter, Energo Veritas OÜ, Harju Elekter Oy, Harju Elekter Kiinteistöt Oy, Telesilta Oy, Harju Elekter AB, Harju Elekter Services AB and Harju Elekter UAB (the "Group"). AS Harju Elekter Group has been listed on Tallinn Stock Exchange since 30 September 1997; 30.10% of its shares are held by AS Harju KEK.

On January, 2024, the merger of AS Harju Elekter Group's Swedish subsidiaries AS Harju Elekter Group LC Development Fastigheter 17 AB with Harju Elekter Services AB was entered into the commercial register.

The consolidated interim financial statements of AS Harju Elekter Group and its subsidiaries have been prepared in accordance with International Reporting Standards (IFRS) as adopted by the European Union. This consolidated interim report is prepared in accordance with the requirements for international accounting standard IAS 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" on condensed interim financial statements. The interim report is prepared on the basis of the same accounting methods as used in the annual report concerning the period ending on 31 December 2023. The interim report should be read in conjunction with the Group's annual report of 2023, which is prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

According to the assessment of the Management Board, the interim report for the first quarter and 3 months of 2024 of AS Harju Elekter Group presents a true and fair view of the financial result of the consolidation Group guided by the going-concern assumption. This interim report has been neither audited nor reviewed by auditors and only includes the consolidated reports of the Group.

The financial statements are presented in euros, which is the Group's functional and presentation currency. The consolidated interim financial statement has been drawn up in thousands of euros and all the figures have been rounded to the nearest thousand, unless indicated otherwise.

In 2023, AS Harju Elekter Group increased the share capital of the company by 131,835 euros by issuing new ordinary shares without nominal values in connection with the exercise of the employee stock option plan. A total of 209,262 ordinary shares were subscribed for at a book value of 0.63 euros per share. Following the share capital increase, the share capital of AS Harju Elekter Group amounted to 11,655 thousand euros divided into 18.5 million ordinary shares without a nominal value.

#### Note 7 Segment reporting

In the consolidated financial statements, two main segments are distinguished: Production and Real Estate. Non-segmented areas of activity are grouped under Other activities, where each area of activity does not have a large enough share to form a separately reported segment.

*Production* – manufacturing and sale of electricity distribution and control equipment as well associated activities. This segment includes the Group's companies AS Harju Elekter, Harju Elekter Oy, Harju Elekter UAB and Harju Elekter AB.

Real estate – real estate development, maintenance and leasing, services related to the maintenance of real estate and production capacity and intermediation of services. Real estate has been identified as a reportable segment because its result and assets are more than 10% of the total result and assets of all segments. This business line includes the parent company, Harju Elekter Kiinteistöt Oy and Harju Elekter Services AB.

Other activities — sales of the products of the Group and its related companies as well as products needed for electrical installation works; management services, project management for installation works and electrical engineering for shipbuilding. Other activities are of less importance to the Group and none of them constitutes a separate segment for reporting purposes. This segment includes the Parent Company and the Group's subsidiaries Energo Veritas OÜ and Telesilta Oy. Other activities are of less importance to the Group and none of them constitutes a separate segment for reporting purposes.

The Group assesses the performance of its operating segments on the basis of revenue and operating profit. Based on the assessment of the Parent company's Management Board, inter-segment transactions are carried out on ordinary market terms that do not differ substantially from the terms agreed in transactions conducted with third parties. Unallocated assets comprise the Parent company's other receivables, prepayments, and other financial investments. Unallocated liabilities consist of the Parent company's (in Estonia) interest-bearing loans and borrowings (exc. borrowings for Real estate), tax liabilities and accrued expenses.

#### Note 8 Basic and diluted earnings per share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit for the reporting period with the weighted average number of shares issued during the period. Diluted earnings per share are calculated by taking into account the shares that will be potentially issued. The resolution of the general meeting of shareholders held on 29 April 2021 approved the new 2021–2022 share option programme, under which the members of the Management Boards and key personnel of AS Harju Elekter Group and its subsidiaries are entitled to receive share options. The issue price of the shares to be acquired on the basis of the option is the average of the closing prices of the shares for the calendar years of 2018, 2019, and 2020 on the Nasdaq Tallinn Stock Exchange as of 31 December, i.e., 4.50 euros per share. As at 31 March 2023, the Group had a total of 153,500 potentially issuable ordinary shares.

As to share-based compensation to which IFRS 2 requirements apply, the subscription price of shares will continue to include the cost of the services provided by employees for the share-based compensation. The value of the service was estimated by an independent expert at 3.55 euros in the 2021 round and 1.52 euros in 2022. Thus, the share subscription prices within the meaning of IFRS 2 are 8.05 euros and 6.02 euros. The potential shares will only become dilutive after their average market price for the period exceeds these values. During the period from 1 January to 31 March 2024, the average market price of the shares was 4.89 (2023 Q1: 5.05) euros.

#### **Share-based payments**

In 2021 and 2022, 25 option contracts were signed with the Group's employees and Members of the company's Management Board, for a total of 189,750 share subscription rights, of which 153,500 shares are potentially issuable at the end of the reporting period. The term of the option programme is two years, plus the term for exercising the options. The exercise period is 36 and 48 months after the written option contract is signed.

During the reporting period, share-based payments recognized as labour costs totalled 30 (Q1 2023: 52) thousand euros, of which the share of the members of the Management and Supervisory Boards was 10 (Q1 2023: 12) thousand euros. The pricing of the option is disclosed in Note 8.
